

### Minutes of Special Meeting, Board of Directors March 27, 2019

The Board of Directors of the Porterville Irrigation District met this day in special session at the District office located at 22086 Avenue 160, Porterville, California.

President Borba called the meeting to order at 3:03 p.m.

AGENDA — Manager Geivet stated that we need to consider adding a Letter of Agreement with the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation (Bureau) for approval of temporary placement of diesel pump water lines over Friant-Kern Canal (FKC) bank. He noted that a district customer is ready to install temporary pumps in the FKC on the East side of the canal across from the Wood Central outlet for the purposes of recharge into a new basin where they would otherwise be unable to obtain surface water.

LETTER OF AGREEMENT NO. 19-LC-20-2499 — Review and consider authorizing a Letter of Agreement No. 19-LC-20-2499 — Porterville Irrigation District - Approval of temporary placement of diesel pump water lines over Friant-Kern Canal bank.

The Manager reviewed a letter from the Bureau as well as a draft resolution authorizing the Manager to sign the Letter of Agreement as presented.

# RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE EXECUTION OF LETTER OF AGREEMENT NO. 19-LC-20-2499 BETWEEN U.S. BUREAU OF RECLAMATION AND PORTERVILLE IRRIGATION DISTRICT FOR TEMPORARY PLACEMENT OF DIESEL PUMP WATER LINES OVER FRIANT-KERN CANAL BANKS

## GROUNDWATER RECHARGE POLICY – Review and consider amending the District's Policy Principles for Landowner Groundwater Recharge Program.

Mr. Geivet brought the Board and guests up to date on current practices of other Eastern Tule Subbasin districts in regards to recognizing a percentage of irrigation deliveries as subbasin recharge while we are in flood release mode. He presented for their review and approval a revised policy with added language that would allow the Board the flexibility to make this determination while excess water is in the system to encourage surface water use by District customers. He noted that Saucelito ID and Lower Tule River ID are recognizing 75% and 50% respectively during current uncontrolled season status.

M/S/U McCowan, Gisler to amend the District's Policy Principles for Landowner Groundwater Recharge Program to include an additional paragraph as included below; as well as to recognize 50% of all customer irrigation deliveries for March and April 2019 as recharge to the subbasin:

## POLICY PRINCIPLES FOR PORTERVILLE IRRIGATION DISTRICT LANDOWNER GROUNDWATER RECHARGE PROGRAM

In furtherance of the District's project to manage surface and groundwater supplies available within the District, the District authorizes the delivery of District water supplies to Landowners for groundwater recharge purposes according to the following principles:

- Subject to the District rules and regulations regarding the availability and pricing
  of District water supply, a Landowner may schedule with the District delivery of
  water for groundwater recharge on its lands located within the District.
- 2. At the sole cost of the Landowner, all water delivered by the District to the Landowner for groundwater recharge shall be measured and recorded with equipment furnished, installed, operated, and maintained by the District at the point or points of delivery approved by the District. The District shall use the information obtained from the meter to prepare a written statement, bill, and report of the water delivered by the District to the Landowner.
- 3. The Landowner shall be responsible for the control, carriage, handling, use, disposal, or distribution of water delivered by the District for groundwater recharge beyond the delivery points approved by the District.

- 4. The Landowner, at its sole expense, shall be responsible for maintaining accurate and complete accounting records for water delivered to a Landowner's groundwater recharge facility and the total net amount of water recharged to the groundwater aquifer within the District. Each month, the Landowner shall provide the District with a written report stating the amount of water the Landowner delivered to each recharge facility and the total net amount of the water recharged to the groundwater aquifer.
- 5. The Landowner, at its sole expense and risk, shall be responsible for the design, construction, operation, maintenance, repair and replacement of groundwater recharge facilities, equipment, appurtenances, and any legal and regulatory compliance of groundwater recharge activities.
- 6. The Landowner may, at is sole discretion, extract the recharged water from time to time, at its sole expense, as the Landowner may desire for its farming operations or other purposes within the District.
- 7. During flood periods as determined by the PID Board of Directors, landowner may, in its discretion, apply excess irrigation waters through normal irrigation facilities for purposes of recharge. The District recognizes 50% of such waters as a recharge to the subbasin. Pursuant to Section 6, Landowner may later extract such waters for beneficial use within the District at its sole discretion. Pursuant to Section 4, Landowner is responsible for all accounting.
- 8. The Landowner shall indemnify and hold harmless the District, its board of directors, officers, employees, agents, assigns on account of damage or claim of damage of any nature whatsoever for which there is legal responsibility, including property damage, personal injury, or death, and including attorneys' fees and other costs of litigation, arising out of or connected with the control, carriage, handling, use, disposal, or distribution of water for groundwater recharge.
