

To Whom it May Concern,

The California Department of Food and Agriculture has a grant program available to growers seeking to implement on-farm projects that save water and reduce greenhouse gas emissions. This opportunity is called the State Water Efficiency and Enhancement Program (SWEEP), and we think it's important for your growers to be aware of the SWEEP grant.

SWEEP is a unique grant program that does not require growers to provide matching funds (though it is encouraged). Projects of up to \$200,000 can be covered by SWEEP funding to help farmers comply with SGMA, reduce costs, and continue farming in California.

Historically, applicants have been able to apply directly to CDFA for funding. This year, however, **CDFA** has been awarded an unprecedented \$110 Million for SWEEP, creating new administrative hurdles for them. To overcome these hurdles, CDFA has introduced a pilot block grant program. Block grant recipients will administer their own grant applications for growers in early spring. Then, the traditional solicitation through CDFA will likely commence during the summer of 2023.

If this sounds a bit confusing, that's because it is! Tule, HotSpot AG, and Innovative Ag Services would like to work with your organization to explain SWEEP to your growers and share tips for application preparation. With so much money available this year, growers have more opportunity than ever to receive funding for on-farm upgrades and they deserve to know about it!
